



What has been your family's primary mode of learning this year?

Grades of children attending BFA (select all that apply):




Responses vs # Families over prior 4 years




How satisfied are you with the curriculum provided at BFA? Please answer for all grade levels in your family:

Do you feel the students review graded material (tests, quizzes, projects) at school in a timely fashion to ensure understanding of the material? Please answer for all grade levels in your family:




CURRICULUM COMMENTS


- It has been a really tough year, but I think everybody is doing their best to get the kids a learning experience, resembling someone of normalcy
- Overall this year has been good as far as BFA. Teachers, students and staff have had such rough go of it, but I'm very happy BFA was able to offer 4 days each week for most of year.
- This curricula experience has been outstanding. This is our first year. The teachers are incredibly knowledgeable yet able to adapt according to student.
- I wish the home school days (Wednesdays) had more work for him
- Sometimes we were not aware of grades in a timely fashion, but we also realize that the teachers are spread thin this year. Most of the time we received information quickly.
- Would like to have the option for conference even if student is not considered "struggling"
- Outstanding compared to prior neighborhood school
- I've been very happy through 4th grade. Each teacher makes every effort to ensure the kids understand what they will be tested over.
- I am not clear on what type of review happens after work is completed / tests are taken

SAC Recommendations: Work on providing more details and timely responses for assignments/quizzes/reports/tests, both to students and parents.




ONLINE ONLY COMMENTS


- "Completely impressed and satisfied with the curriculum and delivery online" would be an understatement. The 3rd grade team pre-recorded lessons, posted schedules of activities weekly, graded assignments and posted comments quickly, and have always been super communicative and responsive when I've reached out with questions. I cannot say enough good things about this team.
- It took us some time to "get in a groove" for online learning, but at this point I am very happy with it and my student has grown academically. If it would possible to have more direct feedback to assignments earlier in the year that would be helpful to better establish expectations.
- We liked the flexibility of BFA's online learning and that my son did not have to sit in front of the computer from 8 to 3.
- We feel that our students' teachers are doing the best possible job under the circumstances to provide online learning to our students.
- The way remote learning was set up is more like guided homeschool. There is not enough teacher instruction or interaction for a kindergartener to do the work without significant parent assistance. While we appreciate the remote option, we feel like not much has been done to review or improve it throughout the year, and opportunities for feedback have been minimal.
- I wish there had been more interaction with teachers and classmates for the remote kids. For example, having the classes streamed live so they can hear what the teacher is saying, and interact with their peers would have been much preferred compared to what feels mostly like independent learning.
- My child has not had any one-on-ones for either the first or second trimester. I believe these are crucial in order to gage students understanding and progress. My student has 4 zoom meetings a week. I don't believe that her progress and level of understanding can be fully gaged by those zoom meetings and her assignments alone.

SAC Recommendations: Quantitative results indicate that over half of online only families are satisfied or highly satisfied with remote learning (65.6%). From the comments, however, it appears there was potentially a missed opportunity to get feedback from online only families throughout the year in order to improve their experience with the remote learning option. One recommendation would be to solicit further feedback from these families on how to ease their transition back to in person learning in the fall.


REMOTE WEDNESDAY COMMENTS

- Love the remote Wednesdays! Would honestly love them in a non-covid year also.
- Minimal learning on Weds days. I don't feel that my kids are learning much, just doing busy work.
- Prefer to have kids in school 100%, but understand the current need for remote Wednesdays. However, if parents still want to keep kids at home/online in Fall, please have them switch to the regular DougCo Online program...and give them some sort of priority if they want to return to BFA later.
- It would be very helpful if parents could have a syllabus and learning plan the Friday before the next Wednesday remote day. This way they have a clear understanding of what to expect and can do work on the weekends when applicable. In the same vein, the curriculum should be released Tuesday evening. With our schedules, our kids are up early and can begin working on school around 6AM, but the curriculum isn't released yet.
- We love remote Wednesdays. We should keep it forever. It lets kids learn how the college format will be. More self-motivation required, less being led by the hand.
- I know teachers have done their very best. Some students like mine just aren't made for independent remote learning. Many missing assignments, bad grades. I don't think much learning was done those days and I work full time and could not watch over him. For all of the schools who were 100% remote or only hybrid, I can only imagine how frustrating it would have been. Grateful for four days in person.
- Math is the only class that has actual recorded teaching. In my opinion, if we have to be remote on Wed, it should look like any other day with scheduled live zoom calls with actual teaching for each class
- The workload for Wednesdays are lighter, taking only a few hours for my students to complete, allowing time for creative play and rest. I appreciate that the assignments were appropriate for independent learning and my students were able to successfully complete the work on their own. I am pleased with the lack of busy work given, which was my main worry.

SAC Recommendations: Based on the bulk of parent feedback, remote Wednesdays should be a matter of last resort for next year. Assuming there is still a need to service remote students, the school should first re-examine other options for meeting those needs, such as zooming them into the classroom, or clearing a period for the classroom teacher to meet with remote students during the school day.

IF a remote day must continue, it needs to have more structures in place, such as mandatory zooms, pre-recorded lessons, and materials posted early enough for parents to help "lay things out" before starting their own work day.




HOMEWORK & PROJECTS COMMENTS


- The homework and projects for Science, Social Studies and Math seem appropriate
- There are many times when all the tests fall on Fridays (3+ tests). It would be nice to spread them out.
- So far I feel like most teachers understand kids need to balance between home and school
- Very impressed with quality of assignments and projects. Creative, diligent and meaningful assignments provided.
- The amount of homework is fine in 7th and has taught our daughter how to prioritize.
- Graded tests/assignments are not reviewed by teacher with my son; my son's experience with the math curriculum is that he does the mechanics but does not fully understand the concepts
- We would like most of our children's work to be completed in class. We would like more time for outside activities, down time for our kids and family time.

SAC Recommendations: Need to prioritize 1-2 communication sources for parents to know what the homework/projects are. Also, parents need to be encouraged to engage with their student's teacher(s) if they need to clarify expectations for homework and level of parent involvement in that homework.








GT, 504, AND IEP COMMENTS


SECOND STEP COMMENTS

- I love that Second Step is used at BFA!



TEACHER COMMUNICATION COMMENTS

- The teachers have been great in this crazy year! Whelan and Lindgren are our sources for the year and I have nothing but great things to say. My kids love going in person and, zoom calls and we've never wondered what we needed to do during quarantine or remote days
- Mrs. Murray made it a priority to have 2 Zooms per weeks with just the remote kids. We really appreciated that.
- We receive our student's graded material with corrections in a timely manner. There is no additional parent feedback/guidance- crucial for parents of remote learners.
- Google classroom has been kept up to date for at home Wednesdays, but the website and homework calendars have not been utilized this year.
- I have an earlier riser with anxiety that would like her assignments first thing.
- Linda Wilson feels like part of our family. She's honest and sincere in her communication and if we've missed anything during this school year, it was our own fault!
- Teachers have been communicative and outstanding
- There has been little to no communication from the teachers this year
- Great job in challenging second year of global germ attack

SAC recommendations: Overall majority of comments were very positive. A possible improvement could come from paring down the number of homework/test sources to one web page and one grade specific newsletter.




FOUR COMMUNICATION AVENUE COMMENTS


COVID COMMUNICATION COMMENTS

SAC Recommendation: Keep up the open and honest communication in a timely manner.






FRONT OFFICE COMMENTS


- LOVE the front staff!!!





Do you expect to have your child(ren) attend Middle School at BFA? 384 responses





CHANGING MIDDLE SCHOOL COMMENTS

- STEM most likely. The project based learning curriculum is amazing to help students develop their 21st century skills
- We were going to continue to homeschool, but we got lots of good reports about BFA from friends.
- Potentially move to private middle as we are hoping to have them attend private high school and entering as a 7th/8th might ease the transition. If not, would def keep at BFA
- Mountain Ridge Middle School-- my daughter hasn't really made close friends at the school and it's more convenient for us if she goes to the school near our house. We will probably let her decide when the time comes.




HONORS COMMENTS

- I would like to create a seminar class for middle-schoolers that centered on their unique talents and how they can use them in school and beyond.


SAC Recommendation: Highlight a different opportunity in newsletter each week. Also, develop instructions on how to start a new club, activity or volunteering opportunity.

BFA TRADITIONS COMMENTS


- Love the many events and traditions BFA has and have sorely missed them this year. Hopefully next year!!

BFA STRENGTH/CHALLENGES COMMENTS


- BFA is a strong, solid school. We've loved having our boys there. I believe there could be more community.








As a family new to BFA, we would be interested in participating in an online town hall to address any questions we may have before the end of the 2020-2021 school year.
